# Message from Canon Greg Jenks

## 2025 | A Year of Hope

Welcome to worship this week as we continue our journey through the Sundays of Epiphany, that season between Christmas and Lent when we are invited to be vigilant for those epiphany moments in our everyday lives when we catch a glimpse of God at work among us. For the Ipswich Anglican community, there will be many epiphany moments as we begin our new adventure together as a united parish once more.

This is the latest chapter in the long story of Anglican ministry here in the heart of Ipswich. The present St Paul's Church was begun in 1859, but actually replaced an earlier temporary church built in 1850. However, the first resident priest arrived in Ipswich in 1849, following a land grant from the NSW Government in 1848.

At each stage we have been people of hope.

Later this year we shall commission our new Parish Priest, the Revd Mpole Samuel Masemola. Another epiphany moment. Another moment of hope.

The Diocese has also chosen Hope as its theme for this year and across the national Anglican Church we are preparing for a Season of Hope during the 50 days of Easter this year. The HOPE2025 project involves each and every parish doing at least one new thing to express the good news of Jesus in a fresh way. For the parish of Ipswich, one special project this year will be to develop our digital ministry with the several hundred people who watch the livestream of our Sunday services. This project will be led by Fionn Grieg who is now on placement in the parish as a candidate for ordination. Fionn has agreed to make this her major supervised field education project during her time with us.

We are people of faith. We are people of love. We are people of hope.

# **Diversity**

'Now to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good' 1 Corinthians 12:7.

One of the great blessings of the Mothers Union is the way in which it unites such diverse women from all around the world. This is a product of the gospel of Jesus. We are all one in him. But it is significant also that when Christians gather, we discover that we have different gifts from the Holy Spirit. These gifts are not in opposition to each other. Some are more obvious than others. Just as a body has many different elements, so the Christian family is one but many. The key to using this diversity is love. We bring our gifts to the Lord and seek to use them as they are needed to bless, to encourage, to build up our brothers and sisters. We must not use our gifts to flatter ourselves or triumph over others. When we are tempted to misuse our gifts, we ought to return to 1 Corinthians 13 and be reminded once more of love.

Question for thought: How can I best use my gifts in the service of the Lord?

Gracious Lord, we pray for the Mothers Union in Egypt, with many members who are refugees from South Sudan and Sudan. May the groups in Cairo and Maadi be strengthened by the prayer and fellowship they share. Help them to encourage others to have faith in you. We also pray for members in the Bathurst Diocese and for Lorraine Mitchell the Diocesan President, as they encourage Christian family life in their churches. Amen.


